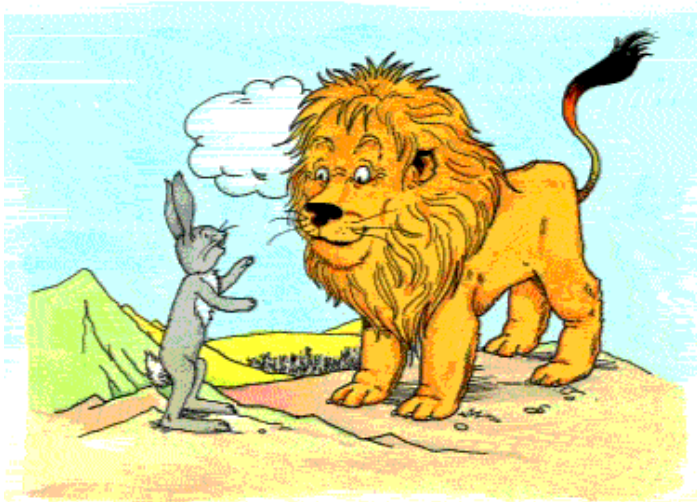


Panchatantra Stories - 1
